DELAWARE OWNERS STATEMENTS FEBRUARY 2010

CHLOE HALL

Second foal, oldest an American Ideal colt now two, from a great bred young pacing mare who took her record by 22 ½ lengths in her second baby race, then suffered a racing injury that kept her from showing the world how good she was meant to be. The second dam, Century p,2,1:55 1/5, is already a 1:54 producer, next dam the foundation mare Dateable. Eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program.

CHANCE HALL

Second foal of a crack race filly with a record of 2:00 at two, 1:55 3/5 at three, winner of \$129,437 with wins in the Arden Downs Stakes and Reynolds Memorial at two and several New York Sires Stakes at both two and three. Her oldest foal is a Cash Hall filly now two. By world champion Tom Ridge, this filly is eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program.

CONNIE JO HALL

Eligible for nomination to the Ontario Sires Stakes and from a half-sister to seven winners including Camelot Hall p,3,1:49 (\$856,639), winner of the \$830,798 Metro Stakes, Nassagaweya Stakes, and eliminations of the Governor's Cup, Cane Pace, Jersey Cup, etc., set New Track Record at The Meadowlands; to Castanet Hall p,3,1:52 3/5f (\$594,429), already a \$100,000 producer, and to Clown's Tears p,4,1:50 4/5f (\$137,831), set all-age track record at Scioto, etc. You can't write a better pacing pedigree.

CELIA HALL

Here is a Cash Hall half-sister to stakes winners Caramba Hall 2,1:56 3/5; 4,1:55 4/5 (Europe) (\$484,683), Cyber Hall 4,1:56 2/5 (\$153,935), and the crack filly Centerfold Hall 2,1:56 3/5 (\$88,136), winner of seven stakes from eight starts at two. We sold her Tom Ridge half-brother for \$25,000 at Harrisburg in November. Eligible for nomination to the New York Sires Stakes program, and six months from now Cash hall could very well be the hottest new trotting sire in the business.

CALLAS HALL

By world champion Tom Ridge, this filly is a half-sister to several trotting winners including Gaelic Mistress 4,1:57 1/5f (\$172,041). We think so much of her dam, Columbine Hanover, that she's now carrying a foal by Deweycheatumhowe. This filly is eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program.

CLARA HALL

This filly is the third foal of her dam, the first two a Banker hall filly now three and a Chip Chip Hooray colt now two. Her dam is a half-sister to Somollison 3,1:56 1/5f (\$497,515), CR Track Master 3,1:55 2/5 (\$238,444), and CR Mungo Jerry 1:56 1/5 (\$189,254), and she descends directly from one of Carl Allen's two foundation mares. This filly is eligible for nomination to the KYSS program, with its \$300,000 finals, and the competition for trotters is quite limited.

CALEB HALL

This Kentucky-sired colt is a half-brother to four fast trotting winners including Cisco Hall 1:55 2/5f (\$286,809) and Celtic Hall 1:55f (\$270,822). There are a very limited number of trotting colts eligible for nomination to the KYSS program with its \$300,000 finals, which means this colt will grow into a very nice profit by the time the yearling sales come around.

DELILAH HALL

First foal from a fast daughter of Hambletonian winner Malabar Man, by world champion Tom Ridge 3,1:50 2/5. This is a strong trotting family. This filly's second dam has a record of 1:58 2/5 and earnings of \$67,874 and is a half-sister to Punk Man 1:55 4/5 (\$369,927), Super Punk 1:56 (\$284,394), and Coffee At Midnight 1:57 1/5 (\$116,401). Eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program.

FIESTA HALL

A pacing filly eligible for nomination in Kentucky, and there are very few of them in her crop. Her dam was stakes-placed several times at two, and she has already produced two fast performers. The second dam is the great producer Mica Lobell, making this filly's dam a half-sister to Sea The USA p,3,1:53 3/5 (\$765,521), Live Or Die p,2,1:51 4/5 (\$728,264) who was second in the balloting for champion two-year-old pacing colt, and Presidential Power p,1:52 4/5 (\$218,993).

GAUNTLET HALL

Second foal, oldest now three, from Gemma Hall, a daughter of Garnelia Angus 4,T1:57 1/5 (\$79,898), who is a full-sister to the great racehorses and sires Andover Hall, Angus Hall, and Conway Hall. What else is there to say?

GATSBY HALL

First foal of stakes-placed Georgia Hall 3,T1:56 2/5 (\$32,852), a fast mare who show quarters of 27 4/5 on her papers, and that's the kind of high speed that makes great producers. World champion Cash Hall's first crop will race at two in 2010, which makes this colt a great pinhooking proposition.

GARNET HALL

First foal of an outstanding racemare who took records of 2:02 1/5 at two, 1:55 2/5 at three, and 1:54 4/5 at four while winning 17 races and \$303,466. Being by leading Ontario sire Striking Sahbra, this filly is eligible for nomination to the Ontario Sires Stakes program, richest in North America.

IMPULSE HALL

Here is a half-brother to four sub-1:55 performers including Invader Hall p,1:51 (\$860,319), Rockapella p,1:51 (\$393,033), and Mary Ann Hall p,3,1:53 2/5 (\$144,601). This is a chance to buy a yearling eligible for nomination in Kentucky who offers great potential for either resale in the fall or as a racing proposition in a program with limited competition and \$300,000 finals at two and three.

KARMA HALL

First foal of a half-sister to Amour Angus and Canne Angus, who between them rewrote the stud book of the American trotter. By world champion Tom Ridge, this filly is eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program. This is a rare chance to acquire a filly with the most precious trotting blood in all of harness racing.

KAREN HALL

Third foal of a Valley Victory daughter of a Garland Lobell half-sister to the two greatest producing sisters in the history of harness racing, Amour Angus and Canne Angus. We sold her half-brother, by Striking Sahbra, for \$30,000 at Harrisburg, and retained her second foal as a broodmare. This filly is by world champion Cash Hall T1:51 1/5h, whose first crop races this year at two, and could very well be the hottest new sire in the business six months from now. Eligible for nomination to the rich NYSS program.

LONG GONE HALL

First foal from a Conway Hall daughter of the beautifully bred Lady Stormont, a winning full or half-sister to Lord Stormont 3,1:53 2/5 (\$901,504), Earl Of Stormont 4,1:55 (\$381,560), Countess Stormont 4,1:55 2/5f (\$258,655), Duke Of Stormont 1:55 2/5f (\$193,346), Queen Of Stormont 3,1:58 3/5 (\$116,891), etc. Next dam is the great racemare and producer Lady Orbitex 4,1:59 3/5f (\$262,730). By world champion Cash Hall T1:51 1/5h, whose first crop races this year at two, he could well be the sport's hottest new sire in six months. Eligible for nomination to the rich NYSS program.

LIBBY HALL

Second foal, oldest a Striking Sahbra colt now two, from a top stakes filly with a record at two of 1:59 3/5 and earnings of \$147,402. By leading Ontario sire Striking Sahbra, this filly has an obvious resale upside, because she is eligible for nomination in Ontario, and her dam, Lookit, won all of her money in the rich Ontario Sires Stakes program.

LOLITA HALL

Half-sister to Largo Hall p,4,1:57 2/5f-'09 (\$32,475), the dam's oldest foal, her only other foal of racing age a two-year-old in 2009 who was timed in 1:59 3/5 in her first start for money. This filly is out of a half-sister to the top mare Coast p,3,1:52 1/5 (\$247,917), second dam stakes winner Refreshing Touch p,3,1:54 1/5 (\$113,800), a daughter of the foundation mare Brets Romance. By top sire Real Desire, this filly is eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program.

MODESTA HALL

Probably the best bred yearling ever to go through an early sale anywhere. She is a full sister to Monsoon Hall p,4,1:50 4/5 (\$821,616), winner of the Niatross and Woodrow Wilson elim, second in \$700,000 final, Hempt Memorial, setting a New Track Record at Pocono, elimination of the Art Rooney, second in the Cane, etc, to Digital Z Tam p,3,1:49 4/5 (\$474,237), Clintons Cigar p,1:51 1/5 (\$349,786), Ma Belle Hall p,4,1:52 4/5 (\$310,064), Mambo Hall p,3,1:52 (\$169,688), and Maytime Hall p,3,1:51 1/5 (\$128,920). We sold her Dragon Again yearling half-sister for \$35,000 last fall at Harrisburg. This is by far the best bred pacing filly eligible for nomination to the KYSS and the \$300,000 finals next year and the year after.

NICKI HALL

Third foal, first foal now three in 2010 and winner of over \$7,000 last year at two, second foal a Tom Ridge filly now two. Out of a full or half-sister to Naughty Hall 3,1:56 (\$100,336), Wewering 1:55 (\$89,619), Natasha Hall 2,2:00 2/5 (\$78,593), and Affinity 2,2:04 3/5 who is already a 1:54 trotting producer. Next dam is the top mare Dormitory, the dam of Super Nice 3,1:58 (\$333,158), and a half-sister to the dam of Hambletonian winner Giant Victory 3,1:54 4/5 (\$1,252,243). Eligible for nomination to the rich Ontario Sires Stakes program.

PARISH HALL

This is a rare chance to buy a yearling half-brother to a trotting winner of over a million dollars, Armbro Chronicle 1:52 4/5 (\$1,199,985), who is one of two O'Brien finalists for older trotters. This colt is also a half-brother to three other solid trotting winners, so every foal of the dam has raced and won on the trot. He is by world champion Cash Hall T1:51 1/5h, whose first crop racing this year at two could very well make him the hottest new sire in the business by the time of the fall yearling sales. This colt is eligible for nomination to the rich NYSS program. An opportunity to buy one like this at an early sale doesn't come around very often.

SMITH HALL

First foal of the dam, who brought \$72,000 as a yearling, and is the only foal of her dam, Abba Hall, who sold for \$95,000 as a yearling. Abba Hall is a full or half-sister to stakes winners Alix Hall 3,1:55 2/5 (\$150,099), Adelaide Hall 2,1:57 4/5 (\$126,924), and George Daniel 4,1:55 2/5 (\$98,750). By one of the two top trotting sires in Kentucky, this filly will be facing limited competition for those \$300,000 KYSS finals at both two and three. This could be the overlay of all the yearlings being sold here at this sale.

SILKWOOD HALL

First foal of a fast mare who won over \$12,000 at two. She didn't take a record, but was twice timed in two minutes with several last quarters in thirty seconds or faster. This filly's second dam is the great racemare Sheezhomewardbound, who took a record of 1:54 3/5 while winning \$573,557, and has already produced two fast record trotting winners from her first three foals including She's A Flirt 3,1:58 1/5 (\$43,510). As a daughter of Cash Hall T1:51 1/5h, she's eligible for nomination to the rich NYSS, and by the fall sales Cash Hall's first crop, who will race at two this year, could very well have made him the sport's hottest new sire.

TRUDY HALL

Half-sister to the two outstanding stakes-winning fillies Pleasure Chest p,2,1:53 4/5; 3,1:50 4/5 (\$601,854), the winner of 13 races including the Juette, Champlain, Simcoe, elims of She's A Great Lady, Matron, etc.; and Mind Boggling p,2,1:55 2/5; 3,1:51 3/5; 4,1:50 3/5 (\$505,553). From the first PA-sired crop by Yankee Cruiser, this filly is eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program.

VIXEN HALL

This is the best bred yearling trotting filly in the sale. She's a half-sister to the stakes winning filly Vamp Hall 2,1:58 3/5 (\$45,084), the only other foal of her dam, who is a three-quarters or half-sister to the undefeated Champion Two-year-old Trotting Colt, Broadway Hall 2,1:56 4/5 (\$436,790; Breeders Crown, etc.), Tom Cango 2,1:57 1/5f; 3,1:53 2/5-'09 (\$448,408), and Boardwalk Hall 2,1:58 1/5; 3,1:53 4/5 (\$119,772). Her second dam, B Cor Tango 4,1:56 3/5, is a full or half-sister to B Cor Pete 1:53 2/5 (\$893,076), B Cor Timgo 1:57f (\$641,641), Yorktown Gunner 3,1:56 (\$249,520), and Clarice Marie 3,1:57 3/5 (\$201,230), etc. If you want great trotting blood, this is as good as it gets. Eligible for nomination to the rich PASS program.

CAPSHAW HALL

We retained this mare as a yearling because she had a great pedigree and the looks to go with it. She was much faster than her record, being officially timed under two minutes twice at two. She is a half-sister to seven fast trotting winners including Habit 2,1:58 2/5 (\$171,776), the dam of four \$100,000 winners including Civil Action 3,1:53 (\$1,123,053). Carrying her first foal, she sells in foal to Hambletonian sire Conway Hall, last bred 4/1/09, with the \$15,000 fee paid, no refund or return.

CARMEN HALL

This was a top race filly with a record of 2:00 at two and 1:55 3/5 at three to go with her earnings of \$129,437. Her first foal is a Cash Hall yearling, and she is carrying her second foal, by world champion Tom Ridge 3,1:50 2/5 (\$886,144), last bred 3/28/09. \$12,000 fee is paid, with no refund or return.

CENTERFOLD HALL

Centerfold Hall was one of the best two-year-old trotting fillies of her year. She won seven of her eight starts, all in stakes, with a record of 1:56 3/5 and earnings over \$80,000. They would have been three times that if we had been smart enough to stake her properly. Her only foal of racing age is Cassini Hall, a two-year-old in 2009 who got a record of 2,2:03 2/5 with earnings of \$25,326. Her second foal is a yearling filly by Cash Hall, whom we are retaining. She sells in foal to world champion Cash Hall T1:51 1/5h, last bred 4/20/09, with the \$3,500 fee paid, no refund, no return.

CLEO HALL

We retained this filly as a yearling because of both her strong pedigree and her extreme good looks. Only a three-year-old, she descends directly from one of Carl Allen's foundation families. In foal to world champion Tom Ridge 3,1:50 2/5 (\$886,144), last bred 4/23/09, the \$12,000 fee is paid, no refund, no return.

CR CAMPFIREGIRL

This great bred mare is the dam of three foals, a Banker Hasll filly now three, a Chip Chip Hooray colt now two, and a Like A Prayer yearling filly. She is a half-sister to Somollison 3,1:56 1/5f (\$497,515), CR Track Master 3,1:55 2/5 (\$238,444), and CR Mungo Jerry 1:56 1/5 (\$189,254). Her second dam is Lurna Jean, Carl Allen's foundation mare. She sells in foal to world champion Tom Ridge 3,1:50 2/5, last bred 5/7/09, so her foal will be eligible to the lucrative PASS program. The \$12,000 fee is paid, no refund or return.

D PUNKEY LADY

This was a fast filly as her race record of 1:57 at three attests. Her dam took a record of 1:58 2/5 while winning \$67,874 and is a half-sister to Punk Man 1:55 4/5 (\$369,927), Super Punk 1:56 (\$284,394), and Coffee At Midnight 1:57 1/5 (\$116,401); and her dam, Precious Punkin 1:59 1/5h (\$149,702), is a full sister to Red Menace 1:56 4/5 (\$190,323) and Pink Tights 3,1:59 4/5f (\$121,471), and a half-sister to Giant Evil 1:56f (\$149,973). Her oldest foal is a yearling filly by world champion Tom Ridge, and she sells in foal to the great Conway Hall, last bred 3/18/09. The \$15,000 fee is paid, no refund or return.

DANIELLA HALL

One look at this three-year-old filly's pedigree and you know why we retained her as a yearling. Her dam, Duches Of Stormont 2,2:04.1h (\$27,708), is a full or half-sister to Lord Stormont 3,1:53 2/5 (\$901,504), Earl Of Stormont 4,1:55 (\$381,560), Countess Stormont 4,1:55 2/5f (\$258,655), Duke Of Stormont 1:55 2/5f (\$193,346), and Queen Of Stormont 3,1:58 3/5 (\$116,891). She sells in foal to world champion Cash Hall T1:51 1/5h, whose first crop races at two this year, last bred 3/30/09, and the \$3,500 fee is paid, no refund, no return.

DRIVE YOU WILD

Another young mare with a beautiful trotting pedigree. Her only foal of racing age is Daria Hall, a two-year-old in '09 who didn't take a record but won over \$40,000 competing against the best Ontario fillies, and was timed in 1:58 3/5 or faster three times. Drive You Wild's second dam is a full-sister to the immortal Speedy Somolli, and you don't get any better than that. We bred her to Deweycheatumhowe last year, which shows what we thought of her, but she is not in foal. She has been under lights for two months, and is clean and sound and ready for early breeding.

ENCHANTING LADY

A \$55,000 yearling, she was plagued by bad luck at the racetrack, until she finally got the chance to show her true colors when she trotted in 1:55 2/5 against the fence at three. Her oldest foal, by Cash Hall, is now a yearling which we are retaining. Last bred 2/23/09, in all probability she will sell with her 2010 foal at her side, a colt or filly from the first crop of the only undefeated Hambletonian winner Deweycheatumhowe 2,1:54 2/5; 3,1:50 4/5 (\$3,155,178).

GEMMA HALL

A rare chance to obtain a daughter of Garnelia Angus, a full sister to Andover Hall, Angus Hall, and Conway Hall. This mare is a half-sister to three in 2:00, including Geisha Hall 3,1:59 2/5f (\$128,322), and to Gwyneth Hall, who has already produced world champion Godiva Hall 4,1:53 3/5f (\$808,008), who is by Like A Prayer, the sire of this mare. We liked her enough to breed her last year to Deweycheatumhowe, but she is not in foal, although she did have two foals the last three years. She is clean and sound for breeding, has been under lights for two months, and is ready for early breeding.

GEORGIA HALL

Another mare we retained as a yearling because she was such a nice individual and had the right kind of pedigree.
